Increased access and range of after school clubs

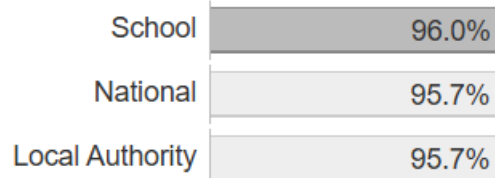
All clubs are free – Mental Health champion in place
